Crash kills two Air Station Marines

YUMA, Ariz. — Two Beaufort Marine Corps Air Station officerss were killed Sunday when their F-4S 'Phantom' jet crashed approximately 65 miles northwest of the Marine Corps Air Station here

Capt. Jeffrey J. Hill, 30, of Shell Point, and Capt. Joseph O. Marthiljohni, 31, of Laurel Bay, died when their plane crashed on a routine training mission.

It was the second tragic crash this year involving Hill,

a native of Akron, Ohio, who barely escaped death after crashing into the Atlantic Ocean in June. The pilot in that crash was killed.

Hill and Marthiljohni, a native of Midland, Tex., were assigned to the Marine Fighter Attack Squadron-Ela at the Beaufort Marine Corps Air Station

The cause of the Sunday crash is under investigation by military authorities.

Hill was a radar intercept officer and Marthiljohni was a pilot.

The victims were identified as Capt. Joseph O. Marthiljohni, 31, of Laurel Bay, the pilot, and Capt. Jeffrey J. Hill, 30, of Burton, the radar intercept operator

Marthiljohni, 31, was a native of Midland, Tex. Hill was a native of Akron, Ohio.

The cause of the crash is under investigation.
