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
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Synopsis of Sequential Listing of Significant Events, VMFA-251 period 1 July 1967 to 31 December 1967.

- 1. The following is a synopsis of those significant events listed in enclosure (3).
- a. VMFA-251 ended calendar year 1967 under the command of Lieutenant Colonel L. R. HAWKINS and was based at Marine Corps Air Station, Beaufort, South Carolina. During this reporting period the squadron has continued to stress the training of aircrews and men to provide them the necessary experience to fully qualify them for an overseas combat tour. The Squadron has also provided an accelerated training syllabus for eleven temporarily assigned pilots. An approximate breakdown of the combat training aircrews receive is 60% toward air to air tactics and the remainder is used in perfecting air to ground ordnance delivery technique.
- b. On 5 July 1967 Lieutenant Colonel L. R. HAWKINS received for VMFA-251, the 1967 Fleet Marine Force, Atlantic, Annual Aviation Safety Award for 6,083 accident free hours during fiscal year 1967.
- c. VMFA-251 received the Ground Safety Honor Squadron Plaque on 12 July 1967 for "Exceptional Ground Safety Achievement During the Month of June 1967." The plaque is presented monthly to the squadron which sets the lowest monthly ground accident rate per man.
- d. August 5th to 24th saw VMFA-251 deployed to Marine Corps Air Station, Yuma, Arizona for practice in techniques of air to ground ordnance delivery. Average aircrew readiness was increased significantly, and the deployment was considered an overall success.
- e. At an all hands formation on 9 September 1967, Lieutenant Colonel L. R. HAWKINS presented Major T. E. Bradley an Air Medal in recognition of his action while serving in the Republic of South Vietnam.
- f. Major General G. S. Bowman, Deputy Commander, FMFlant, presented VMFA-251 with the CNO Annual Aviation Safety Award during formal ceremonies on September 27, 1967. Lieutenant Colonel L. R. HAWKINS received the award, given "for the most outstanding safety record achieved among fighter and attack squadrons of Fleet Marine Force, Atlantic." At the time of the award the squadron chalked up 29 consecutive accident free months, compiling a total of more than 12,720 hours. The General also presented Captain P. E. Hollands with gold stars in lieu of his 14 and 15 air medal in recognition of his actions while serving in the Republic of South Vietnam.
- g. On 28 September 1967, VMFA-251 aircrews and aircraft participated in TESTEX 15. This was a successful exercise in support of the Commander 2dFleet.
- h. After the annual Inspector General's Inspection from 23 to 25 October 1967, VMFA-251 received multiple "Noteworthy" comments in his critique. These areas covered such widely diversified areas as administration and physical fitness.

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## L. the following is a symposis of those bignificant events licted in GUNFIDENTAL.

i. Members of VMFA-251 completed 15,000 hours of accident free flight with MAG-32 Commanding Officer, G. J. Collins. This record for the squadron was completed on 25 October 1967. The total is three times more hours of accident free flying than any other fighter or attack squadron in the Second Marine Aircraft Wing and VMFA-251 is the first fighter/attack squadron to reach this goal. The squadron went on to complete an accident free calendar year.

j. From 12 November 1967 to 7 December 1967 VMFA-251 deployed at Naval Station, Roosevelt Roads, Puerto Rico. Making extensive use of the facilities of the Atlantic Fleet Weapons Range, the "Thunderbolts" flew a wide range of air to air missions, including firing of the Sparrow III and Sidewinder missles as well as dropping tons of conventional ordnance on nearby

targets.

k. On 24 November 1967 VMFA-251 received the Ground Safety Honor Squadron plaque for "exceptional ground safety acheivement during October 1967."

1. During a formal ceremony on 19 December 1967, Major General H. M. Elwood, Commanding General, 2d MAW, presented VMFA-251 with the Treasury Departments highest award, the Minute Man flag. The award is given for over 90% participation in the U.S. Savings Bonds program. General Elwood also presented Major P. M. Jacobs, Executive Officer of VMFA-251, with the Bronze Star Medal for exceptional services in the Republic of South Vietnam.






1. The Ground Safety Honor Squadron Plaque has been awarded to VMFA-251 for exceptional ground safety achievement during the month of June 1967.


