3. NARRATIVE SUMMARY OF EVENTS

VMFA-251 ended the first half of fiscal year 1969 under the command of LtCol E. C. JOHNSON. The squadron had 19 F-4B aircraft assigned as of 31 December 1968 with 16 aircraft on board. The average number of aircraft assigned for the reporting period was 17. The squadron flew 2,021.9 accident free hours during the reporting period, with a total of 20,958.1 accident free hours. Aircrew training resulted in 20 pilots and 8 NFO's being transferred to WestPac in a combat ready posture. During the same period 58 enlisted men were transferred to WestPac.

On 18 July 1968 LtCol E. C. JOHNSON, commanding Officer of VMFA-251, held a squadron formation and cake cutting ceremony proudly honoring the accident free completion of fiscal year 1968. LtCol JOHNSON expressed his pride in the achievement of such a record and called forth continued performance of the outstanding work of the officers and men of T-Bolt Alley.

On 10 August 1968 VMFA-251 completed its 20,000th accident free hour in the F-4B. According to Captain C. A. BRUMBAUGH, the Aviation Safety Officer, the squadron is the only F-4B squadron with this number of accident free hours. The safety record was confirmed by Major L. A. WHIPLE, F-4 and RF-4 safety officer, Naval Safety Center, Norfolk.

VMFA-251 deployed a detachment to Key West, Florida on 14 September 1968. This small representation from VMFA-251 did the job and did it well and returned home on 14 October 1968 after a successful deployment.

During the period of 8-9 October 1968 the members of VMFA-251 contributed significantly to the success of the group blood drive.

On 10 October 1968 Flt Lt William A. N. LANE reported for duty with VMFA-251 as part of the officer exchange program with the Royal Air Force. He replaces another RAF officer Flt Lt CARR-WHITE who had just about completed his tour of duty with the USMC.

On 16 October 1968 - Sergeant D. L. CHAVIS was awarded the Navy Achievement Medal with a Combat Distinguishing Device for Meritorious Service.

On 21 October 1968 VMFA-251 was assigned the task of providing air superiority and fighter CAP for supporting the attack aircraft in a simulated Group Air Strike on enemy forces approximately 250 miles north of Beaufort. All aircrews and ground personnel were called aboard at midnight and assumed a ready posture by 0400 with four aircraft on a 5 minute alert pad with 6 more aircraft as back ups. The squadron effort was successful and awarded a "well done" by the Group Commander.


On 29 October 1968 - Sergeant N. L. SIZEMORE was awarded the Navy Achievement Medal with Combat "V" for meritorious service against insurgent communist forces (Viet Cong) in the Republic of South Vietnam.

On 31 October 1968 - VMFA-251 was awarded the Outstanding Achievement Trophy and the Commanding General's Trophy for outstanding achievement and superior performance of all missions and tasks assigned during the fiscal year of 1968. The completion of fiscal year 1968 marked over 20,000 accident free hours for VMFA-251. In addition to the above mentioned awards VMFA-251 was also presented with a Trophy from the McDonnell Douglas Aircraft Corporation in appreciation of the outstanding work accomplished by VMFA-251.

On 13 November 1968 - VMFA-251 conducted an Air Defense Exercise called "Apache Brave" in conjunction with the 32nd Air Division of the USAF. Due to professionalism of the men of 251 the operation was a complete success; warranting the presentation of an award from the 32nd Air Division on 20 November 1968 for our outstanding support of Operation "Apache Brave".
